Purpose Statement

Repealing and Replacing June 24, 2024, Policy

Approved December 8, 2025

On June 24, 2024, this Commission adopted a policy outlining concepts and practices critical to establishing the Office of Family Representation and Advocacy (OFRA) as a fair and just organization.

With changing federal policies and priorities threatening OFRA's Title IV-E funding, the Commission voted 11-0 to repeal the June 24th, 2024, policy and replace it with the following statement of purpose:

OFRA, through partnership with the community, the State of New Mexico, and Pueblos, Nations and Tribes, will avoid a one-size fits all approach so decisions can be made closest to the people OFRA serves, by focusing on outcomes that matter for children and families and using recognized practices to improve performance.
